BRPL continues its fight against tobacco and drug addiction by organizing de-addiction camps across Delhi. In September, over 126 participants attended camps in South and West Delhi, with 104 individuals successfully quitting their habits. Empowering the underprivileged to breathe easy again!

This September, BRPL brought wellness to the students and staff of government schools with eight yoga camps, benefiting 250 individuals. With 2,510 attendees across 60 camps so far, we're committed to fostering a healthier community through the power of yoga.

In September alone, 82 beneficiaries in Uttam Nagar were trained to blend traditional arts with a modern touch, crafting market-ready products, while 25 women in Sangam Vihar gained valuable skills to achieve financial independence and support their families and communities.
