## BYPL celebrates Children's Day

## BYPL Menstrual Hygiene Programme

As a part of its CSR Sashakt initiative, BSES Yamuna Power Limited is actively promoting menstrual hygiene and awareness among women in 13 colleges across Delhi by setting up 126 sets of sanitary napkin vending machine with incinerators and 68040 packets of sanitary napkins.

In partnership with HLL Management Academy, BYPL inaugurated 18 Sanitary Napkin vending machine with incinerators at Hansraj College on 11th November 2024.

This endeavor will positively impact around 23000 female students by providing convenient access to menstrual hygiene products and fostering education about appropriate menstrual hygiene protocols.
